





Local vs Itinerant - Fiscal





Airport Fiscal Highlights

- → FY25 Operating Budget: \$5.4 million
 - → Balanced Budget
 - → \$540,180 Surplus Retained Earnings
- → Self-Supporting/No General Fund money
- → \$17.7 million in Airport's Fund Balance
- → Airport Businesses Contributed \$4.5 million to the City General Fund in last five years (\$882,694 in FY2024)
- → \$375.49 million in Economic Impact to the Region (2018)

In 2024 the City of Manassas signed a Franchise with Avports LLC to renovate and expand the existing Terminal Building for the purpose of providing commercial airline service to the City of Manassas and the surrounding communities in Northern Virginia.



- → Full-Service Airport Manager and Operator
 - → Currently manage 11 Airports
 - → 9 recently awarded in Puerto Rico
- → 95 Year operating history, started as airport management division of Pan Am World Airways in 1927
- → West Street Infrastructure Partners III (WSIP III) is the owner of Avports
- → WSIP III a family of infrastructure investment funds managed by merchant banking business of Goldman Sachs & Co. LLC




- → The Manassas Regional Airport submitted its application for an Airport Operating Certificate (AOC) in February of 2024
- → The Airport staff has been working through the certification process with the FAA and the TSA
- → No Airport in the Commonwealth has gone through the certification process for over 60 years
- → An Environmental Assessment (EA) is required as part of the process
- → The Airport has hired Pro-Tec to provide the ARFF services needed for receipt of the AOC
- → The Airport has hired an Airport Security Coordinator to develop a Airport Security Plan that must be approved by the TSA
















