MANASSAS AVIATION MAINTENANCE



- > Aircraft Owner think differently about maintenance:
  - Most do not get their plane serviced at their based airfield
  - Look for reasons to flying their plane
  - Huge potential savings for a flight under 1 hour
  - ▶ We travel over 1 hour for most avionics work, 3 hours for paint
- All aircraft expenses have skyrocketed since COVID
  - Certified mechanics are scarce and flock to the airlines
  - > Parts suppliers have consolidated and raised prices 2x to 3x
  - Global parts shortages: oil filters, tires, brake linings
  - Aging Aircraft parts increasingly difficult to find

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- The tax relief on aircraft parts in Virginia was much needed and much appreciated
- Not extending it would be a step backward
- Plane owners will fly a bit father (and be happy to do so) for the tax savings
- Likely to realize savings in labor rates as well
- All of the above will raise the cost of providing training aircraft to our students – Fewer Professional Pilots
- If aircraft maintenance operations migrate out of
  Virginia we lose the tax base of airport employees,
  business tax, fuel tax
